

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. To more clearly delineate the level of involvement Kansas secondary students have in CTE and to document technical skills attained by students, three statewide categories have been created: Participants, Concentrators and Completers. This agreement pertains to those students who have reached Completer status, as follows:
