It is the intent of this cooperative effort to provide the student with a non-duplicative program of study leading to enhance employment opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

 To more clearly delineate the level of involvement Kansas secondary students have in CTE and to document technical skills attained by students, three statewide categories have been created: Participants, Concentrators and Completers. This agreement pertains to those students who have reached Completer status, as follows:

Completer: A student earning at least 3.0 credits of CTE courses in the same state-approved Pathway + earning and industry-recognized, comprehensive certification or passing a third-party, end-of-Pathway assessment; schools will report completers each year in the Pathways Authenticated Application (Perkins Accountability); schools will report industry recognized certificate and third-party, end of Pathway assessments each year in the KCAN Authenticated Application; NOTE: the 3.0 credits must include at least 2.0 credits that are a combination of technical and application level courses; NOTE: Technical skill measures for completers can be comprehensive, industry recognized certification OR third-party, comprehensive, end-of-pathway assessment.
